Announcing Season 12



We are extremely excited to announce our 2017-18 season of concerts and events! Season 12 opens with a free concert at Mechanics Hall in honor of our dear patron, Nora Keil, for her 75th birthday. This block-buster performance features Mahler's glorious 4th Symphony (in a chamber music arrangement), and Schubert's beloved Trout Quintet.

Other highlights include a performance of the Mendelssohn Octet (November) and a celebration of Debussy's 100th Birthday (April). A Christmas Baroque (December) at the Worcester Historical Museum and Old Sturbridge features Brandenburg Concertos No. 5 and 6. Our Cafe concerts at Nuovo Restaurant will include

an October brunch (October) and a performance of Dvorak's American Quartet (March). An array of new guest artists will join us throughout the season: Kendra Colton, soprano; Lilit Hartunian, violin; Kevin Owen, french horn; Demetrios Karamintzas, oboe; Andrus Madson, harpsichord; and Katherine Winterstein, violin, to name a few.

ow can musicians, arts managers and administrators, arts educators and students contribute as citizens of a democracy? In what ways can people committed to the arts serve the wider world through their work? These are the questions that motivated an exciting new college course offered jointly by WCMS (Peter Sulski, Ariana Falk and Tracy Kraus) and Prof. Matt Malsky at Clark University. In this new class, "Community Music and Social Action," the Clark students participated in hands-on opportunities in the WCMS Neighborhood Strings program or in the WCMS office, as well as explored related academic topics in arts education, theory and policy.

Led by Peter and Ariana, the college students worked closely with youth at Woodland Academy, Seven Hills Charter School and at the Straight Up Café, to provide creative outlets and opportunities to hone



life skills like discipline, cooperation, imagination, and leadership. Other Clark students in the class worked with Tracy and Jason in the office on a Neighborhood String Storytelling project and web data analytics. In the classroom, Matt, Peter, Ariana and the Clark students explored the notion of the classical musician as an important public figure with a critical role to play in society. We engaged important ideas from the philosophy of aesthetics and education, civil society, and ways that art can play a role in readying people for democracy, and studied musicians and artistic initiatives that have been particularly focused on a positive social impact. It has been a terrific and productive experience for all involved!
